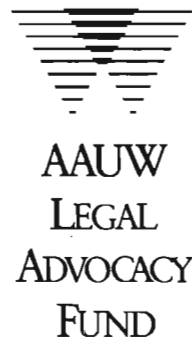

**F**ounded in 1981, the AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund, the nation's largest legal fund focused solely on sex discrimination in higher education, provides funding and a support system for university women fighting sexual harrassment, unjustified or unfair denial of tenure or promotion, pay inequity, pregnancy discrimination, and inequality in athletics programs.
