Discuss your answers to the following questions.

- 1. Did you read the book <u>Hiroshima</u> by John Hersey? If so, what was your reaction? Compare and contrast it to <u>The Hiroshima Cover-Up</u>.
- 2. Author Lesley Blume said "I wanted to find a narrative that would help remind Americans how crucial independent journalism is, and how deadly and widespread the consequences would be without it." Do you think she succeeded?
- 3. Do you think people today suffer from "atrocity" fatigue? (Afghanistan, Haiti, dictators, floods, hurricanes, etc.) Contrast this with people reading about the bombing of Japan after WW2.
- 4. In your opinion, can books serve as a deterrent against future use of nuclear weapons?
- 5. Were you intrigued by Blume's investigative efforts?
- 6. Was this book more about war/bombings or journalism or something else?
- 7. Were you surprised by Blume's description of post WW2 censorship? Are there any lessons from that time that are relevant today?
- 8. How can we support local and/or independent journalism?
